The lecture will examine NATO's 2011 attack on Libya, including the overthrow and killing of its ruler, Colonel Muammar Gaddafi, and the consequences in that country and beyond since then in light of Pan Africanism. He will situate that attack within the wider geo-politics of the 21st Century and struggles for African unity.

Horace Campbell is Professor of African American Studies and Political Science at Syracuse University in Syracuse, New York. He is a well-noted Pan-African scholar, writer, and activist. He will speak to his latest book, *Global NATO and the Catastrophic Failure in Libya: Lessons for Africa in the Forging of African Unity*. Monthly Review Press, 2013.

He is the author of numerous articles, commentaries and books, including *Barack Obama and 21st Century Politics*, *Pan-Africanism*, *Pan-Africanists*, and *African Liberation in the 21st Century*, *Reclaiming Zimbabwe: The Exhaustion of the Patriarchal Model of Liberation*.
