The Norman Paterson School of International Affairs (NPSIA) and the Institute of African Studies (IAS) are pleased to announce new internship placement opportunities in Maputo, Mozambique.

Starting in September 2014, opportunities will be available for internships within the offices of the Canadian High Commission (CHC) in Maputo, reporting directly to the High Commissioner. The CHC is responsible for Mozambique, Malawi and Swaziland.

Internships will be available to students in the IAS, 4th year B.A. Hons. program, and to students in the collaborative M.A. program in African Studies. Students in both the NPSIA M.A. and Ph.D. programs are eligible to participate.

In order to participate, departmental permission is required, as well as completion of 1 year of a student's M.A. program, or 2 years of the Ph.D. program

The 4 month internships will take place in the fall, winter or summer term, based on student and organization availability.

There is no better way to improve your skills and experience in a professional workplace than with an international internship.

This is a unique opportunity to gain on the job training to compliment your studies, and learning experiences that will positively enhance your CV in an increasingly competitive job market.
