

Salvete Omnes!

The Carleton University Classics Society will be holding its Spring General Meeting and Elections. The tentative date is Wednesday, March 26th @ 3:00PM. We are waiting to hear back as to what room it will be held in, so another email will be sent out once we have that information.

At the meeting we shall briefly discuss this past year for the Society, as well as reviewing the changes made to the Society's constitution. The constitution cannot be fully amended until a vote has been made by all members of the society. The most notable changes, however, were those made to the executive body. The new executive structure consists of the following positions:

- President: The President shall be responsible for the administration of the Society, the supervision of the executive and all other responsibilities designated by the constitution, such as the chairing of meetings. Responsibilities not outlined in this constitution shall be the responsibility of the president.

-Treasurer: The treasurer shall have control over and responsibility for all financial matters of CUCS. The Treasurer shall be responsible for the maintenance of the society's financial records, the creation of the CUSA budget, an accurate and ongoing budget as well as methods of raising finances through fundraising. . The Treasurer is required to record all financial transactions of the society in a ledger, which must be presented to any member of the executive on request.

-Secretary: The secretary shall be responsible for the timely notification of all society members of events and meetings, the taking of minutes, the maintenance of society records and a constantly updated membership list as well as giving any assistance to the President or other members of the executive as is needed. The Secretary shall keep a record of the proceedings of meetings of the executive officers and all general meetings of members, and shall conduct all official correspondence of CUCS as required. The Secretary is required to have a working knowledge of the constitution, so that any questions regarding procedure may be readily addressed.

-Ministers: The ministers shall be individually responsible for the creation and running of social and academic events to stimulate social and intellectual contact amongst students in Greek and Roman studies. (There are three minister positions).

That being said, we are currently accepting nominations for all of the aforementioned positions for the Carleton University Classics Society's 2008-2009 academic year.
